Shoot" at Park Gun Club in Orono, on Saturday May 24<sup>th</sup> and the final shoot and award ceremony on Sunday, June 1<sup>st</sup> at Watertown Gun Club in Watertown, MN. MySA offers 24 trophys per shoot, with prizes in 4 youth catagories from Pre-sub, Sub. Jr., Jr. and Jr. Gold as well as Classes A, B, C and D. All youth shooters ages 10 – 23 are welcome. If not an ATA member, we will sign you up at the shoot. New youth shooters, never before ATA members, are paid for by the Minnesota Trap Shooting Association—thank you to the MTA for this fantastic incentive! New AIM youth members who sign up, parents will receive a membership to the ATA for free.
